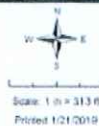

Crape Myrtle (*Lagerstroemia indica*)



Crape Myrtle is a commonly used single or multi-trunk tree, effective as a flowering or foliage accent. It blooms best in full sun, when it receives moderate moisture. It has handsome peeled bark and a colorful summer bloom. Named varieties, which usually grow to 25' or less, include: Glendora White, Near East, Seminole and Watermelon Red.

Bronze Loquat (*Eriobotrya deflexa*)



Bronze Loquat is more often planted than Japanese Loquat. Its shiny bronzy green new foliage with reddish highlights is quite attractive, and it rarely sets fruit. Large panicles of deep pink flowers are showy in the spring. It looks best with regular pruning to maintain its shape, and regular deep watering to promote healthy growth. It is not drought tolerant.

Japanese Privet (*Ligustrum japonicum*)

Japanese Privet is susceptible to Texas root rot. Takes shearing. Has fragrant flower.

African Sumac (*Rhus iancea*)

African Sumac is a dense shade tree, rather graceful with its arching branches and weeping foliage. It is tough and reliable in dry conditions, though it looks best with regular deep watering. It is susceptible to Texas root rot. It is effective as a screen or windbreak, and as an evergreen specimen.

Water Gum (*Tristaniaopsis laurina*)



Water Gum is a tree with a smooth, creamy-brown trunk and perfumed yellow flowers in summer. Leaves turn red in winter in cooler areas.

Chitalpa (Chitalpa tashkentensis)



Chitalpa is an unusual small flowering accent tree, especially useful in riparian or native garden settings, usually multi-trunked or low-branching. It blooms best in full sun, when it receives moderate moisture. It becomes taller in half shade. Its grayish-white bark presents an interesting silhouette in winter with its bare branches.

Eastern Redbud (Cercis canadensis)



Eastern Redbud is a commonly used single or multi-trunk tree, effective as a flowering or foliage accent, in lawns or residential garden settings. Leaves are an attractive lemon in fall. It blooms best in full sun, where it receives moderate moisture. Occasional tent caterpillar attacks can be controlled with spraying.

Chinese Fringe (Chinanthus retusus)



Fringe Tree is an unusual small flowering tree with both female and male trees. It is generally most useful in residential lawn and garden settings, where proper culture can be maintained. Its spring flowering is quite impressive, and is attractive in fall, with the reddish berries seen amongst the yellow fall foliage. It is a very clean looking tree. It is easily maintained below 25' in height. Has fragrant flower.

Aristocrat Pear (*Pyrus calleryana* 'aristocrat')



Aristocrat Pear is fairly resistant to fire blight. Open, wide branching; approximate height is 40 feet.

Australian Willow (*Geijera parvifolia*)

Australian Willow makes good street tree; noninvasive roots, casts light shade. Moderate growth rate.

New Zealand Christmas (SML) (*Metrosideros tomentosa*)



New Zealand Christmas is drought resistant and smog tolerant.

Victorian Box (*Pittosporum undulatum*)

Victorian Box is fairly drought resistant. Cal-IPC (California Invasive Plant Council) classifies the invasiveness of this plant as small and more problematic on north coast. Has fragrant flower.

Purple Leaf Plum (*Prunus cerasifera pissardi*)



Purple Leaf Plum produces a heavy crop of small red plums. Requires a moderate amount of water. Purple foliage all season. Hardy. Has fragrant flower.

Long Leafed Yellow Wood (*Podocarpus henkelii*)



An ornamental tree. Drooping dense dark green foliage; branches droop but resist breakage. It grows at a moderately slow rate of about a foot a year to 20-30 feet high with a spread of about 8 to 15 feet. As conifers, they produce cones, although it is their fruit-like seeds that are most prominent. It is easy to cultivate, tough once established, and incredibly long lived.

Sweet Bay leaves can be used for seasoning. Has fragrant fruit and leaf.

Maidenhair (*Ginkgo biloba* 'autumn gold')

Maidenhair is resistant to oak root fungus. Smog tolerant.

Yew Pine (*Podocarpus macrophyllus*)



Yew Pine needs good drainage.

Marina Strawberry (Arbutus 'marina')

This is a somewhat tender, but highly desirable small yard tree, which bears evergreen leaves. The pendulous clusters of urn-shaped white-blushed-pink flowers are produced year-round along the coast with peaks in spring and fall. The red strawberry like fruit is edible, although has little flavor, but birds are attracted to eat the fruit so no litter is produced. Although slow growing, it can grow to a height of over 40 feet and 20-25 feet width.

Peppermint Willow (*Agonis flexuosa*)



The peppermint tree's attractive weeping character and dark green foliage are quite pleasing. Stems have a distinct zigzag characteristic. It is disease and pest resistant. Has fragrant leaf.

Hong Kong Orchid (*Bauhinia blakeana*)



This small tree grows to about 20 to 40 feet tall with a light gray smooth bark and an umbrella-shape habit. It has rose-purple fragrant flowers. A great tree in frost-free areas with flowers that are attractive to humans and hummingbirds and even as they drop, make a beautiful groundcover. There is no fruit on this tree.

Gold Medallion (*Cassia leptophylla*)

Although it shares the large, showy flowers and tropical-looking foliage of its cousins, gold medallion tree is much harder to frost, dry heat, and drought. Each cluster produces thirty to fifty, fragrant, bright yellow, and 3-inch wide flowers over a long blooming period; the show is more spectacular as the weather heats up.

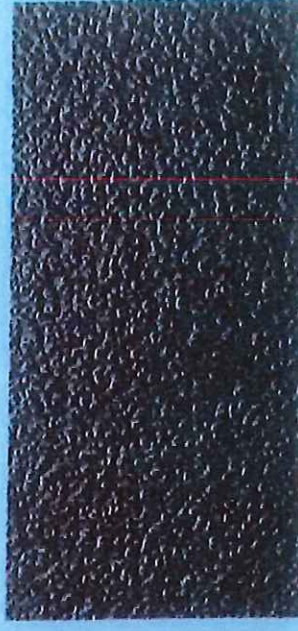
